It was a painful journey all these years.” Explaining about the disease, Dr Deepak Gupta, Senior Consultant and HOD, Ophthalmology, Fortis Hospital, Ludhiana, said, “Left Eye Sixth Nerve Palsy of congenital nature is seen in few cases of Abducens Nerve palsy, maybe once or twice in a year.

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
